1 Shmuel 1.13-15 Hannah was speaking in her heart - her lips moved, but her voice could not be heard -so **Eli thought she was drunk**. 'Eli said to her, "How long are you going to stay drunk? Stop drinking your wine!" But Hannah answered, "No, my lord, **I am a very unhappy woman**."





1 Shmuel 22.1-2 David left there and took refuge in the Cave of 'Adulam. When his brothers and the rest of his father's family heard of it, they went down to see him there. Then **all the people in distress, in debt or embittered began gathering around him**, and he became their leader; there were about four hundred with him.

1 Cor 4.11-13 Till this very moment we go hungry and thirsty, we are dressed in rags, we are treated roughly, we wander from place to place, we exhaust ourselves working with our own hands for our living. When we are cursed, we keep on blessing; when we are persecuted, we go on putting up with it; when we are slandered, we continue making our appeal. We are the world's garbage, the **scum of the earth** - yes, to this moment!

2 Cor 11. 23-31 I've worked much harder, been imprisoned more often, suffered more beatings, been near death over and over. Five times I received "forty lashes less one" from the Jews. Three times I was beaten with rods. Once I was stoned. Three times I was shipwrecked. I spent a night and a day in the open sea.

2 Cor 11. 23-31 In my many travels I have been exposed to danger from rivers, danger from robbers, danger from my own people, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the desert, danger at sea, danger from false brothers. I have toiled and endured hardship, often not had enough sleep, been hungry and thirsty, frequently gone without food, been cold and naked.

2 Cor 11. 23-31 And besides these external matters, there is the daily pressure of my anxious concern for all the congregations. Who is weak without my sharing his weakness? Who falls into sin without my burning inside? If I must boast, I will boast about things that show how weak I am. God the Father of the Lord Yeshua - blessed be he forever - knows that I am not lying!

2 Cor 11. 23-31 **When I was in Dalmanuta, the governor under King Aretas had the city of Dalmanuta guarded in order to arrest me; but I was lowered in a basket through an opening in the wall and escaped his clutches.**

Scum of the earth!

Yeshayahu / Isaiah 53.2-3 He was not well-formed or especially handsome; we saw him, but his appearance did not attract us. People despised and avoided him, a man of pains, well acquainted with illness. Like someone from whom people turn their faces, he was despised; we did not value him.

Yeshayahu 42.4 He will **not weaken or be crushed** until he has established justice on the earth, and the coastlands wait for his Torah." CJB

Messianic Jews 12. Keep running with endurance in the contest set before us, looking away to the Initiator and Completer of that trusting, Yeshua - who, in exchange for obtaining **the joy set before him**, endured execution on a stake as a criminal, scorning the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. 3 Yes, **think about him** who endured such hostility against himself from sinners, so that you won't grow tired or become despondent.

Yeshayahu 63.1-3 Who is this, coming from Edom, from Botzrah with clothing stained crimson, so magnificently dressed, so stately in his great strength? "It is I, who speak victoriously, I, well able to save." Why is your apparel red, your clothes like someone treading a winepress? "I have trodden the winepress alone; from the peoples, not one was with me.

Tehillim/Psalm 45.2-7 You are the most handsome of men; gracious speech flows from your lips. For God has blessed you forever. Warrior, strap your sword at your thigh; [gird on] your splendor and majesty. In your majesty, succeed, **ride on in the cause of truth**, meekness and righteousness. May your right hand teach you awesome things.

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Tehillim/Psalm 45.2-7 Your arrows are sharp. The people fall under you, as they penetrate the hearts of the king's enemies. Your throne, God, will last forever and ever; you rule your kingdom with a scepter of equity. You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness. Therefore God, your God, has **anointed you with the oil of joy** in preference to your companions.

Revelation 1.4-7 **Grace and shalom** to you from the One who is, who was and who is coming; from the sevenfold Spirit before his throne; 5 and from Yeshua the Messiah, the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead and the ruler of the earth's kings. To him, the one who loves us, **who has freed us from our sins** at the cost of his blood,

Revelation 1.4-7 who has caused us to be a kingdom, that is, cohanim for God, his Father - to him be the glory and the rulership forever and ever.

Amen. Look! He is coming with the clouds! Every eye will see him, including those who pierced him; and all the tribes of the Land will mourn him. Yes! Amen!
