I forgot my contact lenses at the hotel, so I had to watch the officials to know if the kick was good or not. Coach, I couldn't even see the goalposts." At first, Daugherty was mad. If he had known this information, he wouldn't have sent the kicker into the game. But the more he thought about it, the

less angry he became. And the more impressed.

Kaiser kicked the ball perfectly because he was a supremely disciplined kicker. He knew the distance and the angle...He didn't need to see the ball. Hours and hours of practice, and careful discipline, allowed him to kick the winning field goal, even if he couldn't see the ball.
