

Dr. Lutzer, on Focus on the Family radio, was describing talking to his daughter about the MOST important thing to her in his life and ministry. His daughter said the <u>most</u> significant thing was his practice of apologizing when he was wrong.

We have two things, humanly, in our "inventory" of tools.

- 1. Integrity [honesty, sexual purity]
- 2. Love [love means giving]
  - Holy Spirit makes these real to people.



Tiger parenting is a form of strict parenting, whereby parents are highly invested in ensuring their children's success, push their children to attain high levels of achievement or success.

[Several cultures are perfectionist like this. Asians and Jews.]

So, I'm a bit of a Tiger parent. Sought perfection in my kids. I'm sure I did damage. However, the real perfection needed:

Yn 17.22-23 The glory that You have given to Me I have given to them, that they may be one just as We are one— I in them and You in Me—that <u>they may be perfected in unity</u>, so that the world may know that You sent Me and loved them as You loved Me.

[Bigger than perfected music, magnificent vocals, instrumentation, technol, sound, lights, dance Heard of sloppy agape? Shoddy job but love will cover. Abhorrent to me. I've got all the obsessiveness of Tiger Mom. Likely damaged my kids with it.

Nevertheless, this agape is the ONE thing we MUST have perfected.]

What if the love and unity break? [What is a Dad's responsibility?]

<sup>Gal 6.1-2</sup> Brothers, suppose someone is caught doing something wrong. You who have the Spirit should set him right, but in a spirit of humility, keeping an eye on yourselves so that you won't be tempted too.

Matt 18.15-16 "Moreover, if your brother commits a sin against you, go and show him his fault — but privately, just between the two of you. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother. If he doesn't listen, take one or two others with you so that every accusation can be supported by the testimony of two or three witnesses.

[That has been one of my main roles in the 29 years of Or HaOlam, 1995 till 2024. One of the one or two more. Often G-d breaks through with great reconciliation. Lasting reconciliation. I'm still available and love it. But there is an attitudinal requirement.]



Nancy Pearcey is professor and scholar in residence at Houston Christian University. She has been quoted in *The New Yorker* and *Newsweek*, highlighted as one of the five top women apologists by *Christianity Today*, and hailed in *The Economist* as "America's pre-eminent evangelical Protestant female intellectual."

"Born into a culturally Lutheran family, Nancy Pearcey expected for someone to be able to answer this question of the basis of faith. However, that was not the case. Today on Family Talk, Roger Marsh discusses with Nancy how this deepseated personal search for truth set her feet upon a path that would lead her to



research that not only proves the Bible faith is true, but that without it, our society spirals out of

control. They also discuss Nancy's latest book, *The Toxic War on Masculinity*, and the origins of culture's warped view of men.

She ended up at L'Abri in 1971 with all those hippies, under Francis and Edith Schaeffer in Switzerland. Part of the 'Jesus Revolution.' Found people who could rationally defend the faith and the scriptures.

[Edith Schaeffer who wrote a book, Christianity is Jewish.]

In our culture today, it seems like there is an active vendetta against men and masculinity.

- Washington Post article: Why Can't We Hate Men?
- Book: Are Men Necessary?

James Cameron, director of *Avatar*, wrote, "Talking about healthy masculinity is like talking about healthy cancer ... Testosterone is a toxin. You have to work it out of your system."

Feminists of the 70s said, "A woman without a man is like a fish without a bicycle."

Feminism didn't really start in the 1970s. Before the Industrial Revolution, men worked alongside the wives and children in the farm or trade. Sons were apprentices. "The concept of masculine virtue was duty to God and man," according to secular writers.

In 1842 an article in a magazine called *Parents* said, "The greatest cause of domestic sorrow today is father absence. The father's working late and early." [1842!]

The pandemic was a game changer.

Harvard study: 68% of fathers said they got closer to their children, and don't want to lose that." Quotes from CEOs "We did not see any decrease in productivity during the pandemic." [However, lots of initiatives ...]

1972 Title IX, 1994 Gender Equality Act.

Men are falling behind: higher suicide, drug and alcohol addiction, homelessness, mental illness. Great Depression-era levels

Yeah. It is much worse than I realized when I started the research. Men and boys are falling behind at all levels. Boys start falling behind in kindergarten, because they don't have as good fine motor control, so they can't work a scissors as well. So already they feel like they're falling behind the girls, and they

College is now 60% female, 40% male.

Some colleges are starting football teams just to recruit boys.

There was an article in the British newspaper the *Guardian*, "Women are not finding good men." [Marriageable men are scarce.]

<u>Secularism</u> has produced a more toxic form of masculinity. Darwinian writers say the men who won out on survival were ruthless, brutal savate, barbarian, and predatory.

A best-selling book *Moral Animal.* "Giving men a book on marriage is like giving a booklet to Vikings on how not to pillage."

male authors, but they're speaking from the position of evolutionary psychology. And so when people say, hasn't the concept of masculinity turned toxic? I said, yes, it's the secular view of masculinity that has in fact turned toxic and is telling people, well, it's the source of the Andrew Tate phenomenon. Fast money, fast cars, fast women. That's the paradigm of the secular view.

### The rest of the story ...

There have been sociological studies showing that Bible believing men who attend service regularly test out as the best husbands and fathers. I quote some dozen ... studies ... the most loving, engaged husbands and fathers.

Their wives are tested separately ... the happiest the way their husbands treat them. Evangelical men spend more time with their children than any other group. 3.5 hrs/week more than secular men. 35% lower divorce than secular men.

Lowest rate of domestic abuse and violence.

In the NY Times, "The happiest of all wives in America are religious conservatives." Fully 73% of women who hold conservative gender values and attend services regularly with their husbands have high quality marriages.

Haven't we all heard that believer's divorce at the same rate as the Western Culture? Researchers then separated out the nominal believers. Nominal believers' wives report the lowest level of happiness. Higher divorce than seculars.

Nominal believers have 20% higher divorce than seculars, and the highest rate of domestic violence and abuse.

So if I can paint a picture here, top of the heap is Christian men actively engaged in their faith, wives have the happiest level of happiness. Second is people with no faith, and they're getting by. That the bottom of the heap is the nominal Christian who says, I'm a professing Christian, but I'm not really living out my faith. And that's where the divorce, the domestic abuse, the distancing from children, that's all happening. That's graphic.

The nominal believer will take religious justification for the mistreatment of their family. Men are just bigger, stronger, faster, and because of testosterone, they're more aggressive and risk taking. And ... that is good. Creationally.

[Whenever someone has to quote to his wife, "Submit," he's lost it. Public dad and private dad. Knuckle fist.]

Nominal believer men are worse than secular men. Often the woman is blamed. Kindness is weakness to a bully. Consider Hamas.

Loving confrontation. Matthew 18

Preach on abuse and perversion. You don't know who or where.

Tendency is to give roses to the mothers, and exhort / scold the men. Encourage our men!
