



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Luke 14.11 Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted.

Mtt 11.28-29 “Come to me, all of you who are struggling and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, because I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

Matt 23.11-12 But the greatest among
you shall be your servant.
Whoever exalts himself shall be
humbled, and whoever humbles
himself shall be exalted.

Lk 22.24-27 An argument arose among them as to which of them should be considered the greatest. But Yeshua said to them, “The kings of the Goyim lord it over them; and those in authority over them are given the title, ‘Benefactor.’ But not so with you!

Lk 22.24-27 On the contrary, let the greater among you become like the younger, and one who rules like one who serves. For who is greater? The one reclining at the table? or the one who serves? It's the one reclining at the table, isn't it? But I myself am among you like one who serves.

Lk 11.7-11 When Yeshua noticed how the guests were choosing for themselves the best seats at the table, he told them this parable: “When you are invited by someone to a wedding feast, don’t sit down in the best seat; because if there is someone more important than you who has been invited,

Lk 11.7-11 the person who invited both of you might come and say to you, 'Give this man your place.' Then you will be humiliated as you go to take the least important place. Instead, when you are invited, go and sit in the least important place; so that when the one who invited you comes,

Lk 11.7-11 he will say to you, 'Go on up to a better seat.' Then you will be honored in front of everyone sitting with you. Because everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but everyone who humbles himself will be exalted."

Mt 18.1-6 At that hour the disciples came to Yeshua, saying, “Who then is greatest in the kingdom of heaven?” And He called a child to Himself, set him in the midst of them, and said, “Amen, I tell you, unless you turn and become like children, you shall never enter the kingdom of heaven.”

Mt 18.1-6 Whoever then shall humble himself like this child, this one is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes one such child in My name, welcomes Me. “But whoever causes one of these little ones who trust in Me to stumble,

Mt 18.1-6 it would be better for him to
have a heavy millstone hung
around his neck and to be sunk in
the depth of the sea!

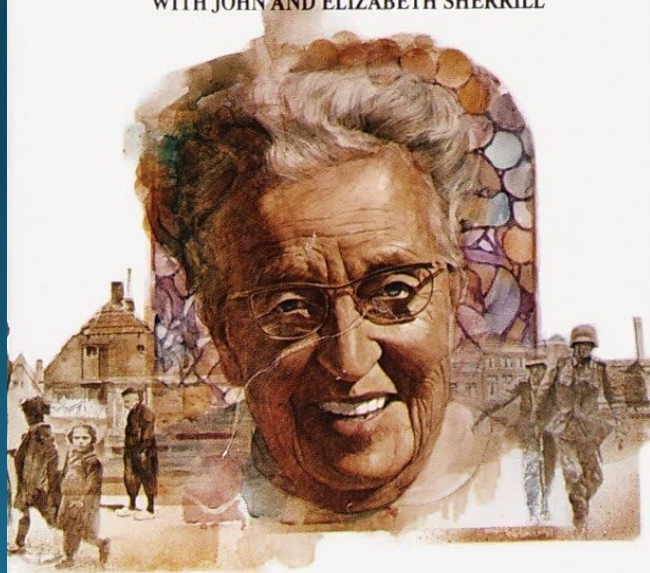

Is it always wrong to lie? What if it's for a good reason? What if telling the truth put you or others in danger?

Hiding Jews in Nazi occupied Holland was a dangerous task and the ten Booms,

who had always believed it was wrong to lie, found themselves wondering if they might have to. Corrie argued it wasn't wrong to lie if it meant saving someone's life.

Her sister, Nollie disagreed. “We are to keep God’s commandment. If we do, He will honour that obedience.”

It would soon be put to the test.

Men and boys, from sixteen to thirty, were being rounded up by the Nazis and taken to work in the munition factories.

It was called the Razzia and such seizures could happen at any time of day or night.

Nollie and her husband, Flip von Woerden, had three boys and the entire family feared they'd soon be taken. As a precaution, the von Woerdens hid the entrance to their cellar — a makeshift hiding place — and the boys stayed as near to home as possible.

One afternoon, while the family was preparing to celebrate Flip's birthday, a group of soldiers appeared at the end of the street. Peter and Bob came flying into the kitchen.

It took only moments for them to get into the secret room and the mat to be replaced. The ladies in the kitchen — the van Woerden's youngest daughter, Cocky and their Aunts, Corrie and Betsie heard the front door slam open and soldiers run up the stair. One came into the kitchen waving his rifle as he shouted for the women to move against the wall.

“Do you have brothers?” One of the men asked, singling Cocky out. The soldiers had already made an unsuccessful search of the house.

Cocky glanced nervously at her aunts, wishing they could tell her what to say. All her life she had been told not to lie, but what about now? She tried to guess what her parents would say.

“Well?”

Cocky nodded. “Yes. Three.”

The man grinned, “And how old are your brothers?”

She wondered how long could she continue to tell the truth. “The oldest is twenty-one. The others are nineteen and eighteen.”

“Good answer. Where are they?”

“The oldest is at Theological College. He doesn’t get home most nights because—“

“And the other two?”

Cocky knew her answer could put her brothers into jeopardy. She couldn't do that, not when they were so close to escaping, not for such a silly conviction. Surely, when her parents had told her she must never lie

they hadn't realized she would have to face a circumstance like this.

She didn't know what to do. She was so nervous she began to laugh. She couldn't help it.

“They are under the table.” She said, laughing still.

The officer walked over to the table and lifted the overhanging cloth. When he turned back to look at Cocky his expression had darkened. He slapped her across the face. “Don’t take us for fools!” He shouted. Motioning for his companion to follow, the young man stormed out of the house.

Cocky hadn't lied. Her brothers were under the table. It was there, under the mat that the trap door to the cellar was hidden.

That evening, the family had a discussion about whether or not Cocky had done the right thing.

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A humble mindset has significant positive effects on our cognitive, interpersonal, and decision-making skills. Humility is directly related to our ability and willingness to learn. Humble people are better learners and problem solvers.

Humble students who are genuinely open to feedback often overtake their naturally more talented peers who think so highly of their own abilities that they reject all advice. Some studies have found that humility is more important as a predictive performance indicator than IQ

Humility in our leaders, moreover,
fosters trust, engagement,
creative strategic thinking, and
generally boosts performance

Those of us who lack cultural humility are more prone to make assumptions about others, feel superior to them, and dramatically overvalue our knowledge and talents in comparison to others

An example is Joffrey Baratheon from *Game of Thrones*. The character of Joffrey is known for his narcissistic entitlement, vastly inflated sense of his talents, and desire to dominate—all traits negatively correlated with humility

Joffrey shows little sympathy or concern for other characters throughout the story, including his own wife, Sansa, whom he treats with severe cruelty. It is little wonder audiences around the world celebrated when he was poisoned and died in Season 4, putting an end to his reign of tyranny.

Humor is a powerful tool. We can all benefit from laughing more about ourselves and our imperfections.

Exercises that hone gratitude and appreciation can boost a humble state of mind. A great starting point is expressing gratitude to others. This invites us to value our important relationships with others.

Think about the people who have influenced us most positively in our lives, truly appreciate their contribution, and demonstrate our gratitude.

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6. Humility of a dog

What is more humble than a dog,
of certain breeds?



The cute canines have brought significant breakthroughs in the lives of several patients, helping a soldier so traumatized by the violence that left him blind in one eye after witnessing the death of his friend that he wouldn't speak,

finally starting to talk again... to little Teddy, one of the therapy dogs. Matry told The Media Line that “something shifted,” and the soldier opened up, began to cry and also began speaking to the dog.

She gave other examples of how therapy dogs have helped to bring unresponsive patients back into action, and others with mental blocks and fears, including Nova survivors, find breakthroughs.

“After a traumatic event, a soldier could be in acute stress, and doctors or nurses may not be able to read him. Somehow, when the dog is there, you ask the soldier not to speak to the nurse or doctors, but speak to the dog,” Hellmann said. “Just looking into the dog’s eyes, there’s something in the chemistry that happens between a human and a dog that can break that threshold and let things come out.”

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
